Wilmington Housing Authority Announces Major Progress on Redevelopment and Rehabilitation Initiatives

Wilmington, NC — The Wilmington Housing Authority (WHA) continues to make significant strides toward revitalizing communities and expanding affordable housing opportunities across the city. During recent discussions, WHA highlighted four key initiatives — the redevelopment of the historic Hillcrest community, the transformation of Houston Moore, the rehabilitation of Solomon Towers, and the rehabilitation and new construction at Jervay.

Representing WHA, Chief Executive Officer Tyrone Garrett announced major progress in advancing the Hillcrest Master Plan, a comprehensive redevelopment effort designed to transform the historic site into a modern, inclusive, and sustainable neighborhood. The Phase 1 development of Hillcrest will be supported by a \$5.7 million grant award from the New Hanover County Endowment (NHE), marking a pivotal step in bringing this vision to life.

Each of these projects underscores WHA's commitment to equitable growth, quality housing, and community connectivity. Through strategic partnerships, innovative design, and thoughtful planning, WHA aims to not only preserve but enhance Wilmington's vibrant neighborhoods — creating lasting opportunities for residents and future generations alike.
